Coronation Gardens



COMPLETION OF THE JUBILEE PROJECT IN THE CORONATION GARDEN

I am pleased to report that the Civic Society's latest project in the Coronation Garden, North Bar Within, was completed in July, ending with a "thank you" celebration there on the 5th for all those directly involved.

Members will know that in 2005 the Society initiated a plan to develop the western end of the Garden as a Sensory Area especially for people with a disability. It proved a real success in attracting more visitors to this central but peaceful spot in the town. However, some renovation was eventually needed to replace certain plants lost in hard winters and to improve the functioning of the water feature.

The Coronation Jubilee was the ideal time for a smaller second stage project to address these needs whilst making improvements to the eastern end of the Garden in recognition of such a special year. The Civic Society took the lead in putting forward money and, as with the first project, the Rotary Club, Beverley Lions and the Macular Society added their financial support. We were then awarded matching funding from the ERYC's Commuted Sums Fund.

The brief agreed with the East Riding Council included provision of more seating while retaining most of the grassed areas. It was decided with our Landscape Architect, Richard Lancaster, who designed the Sensory Area, to create a central circular feature based on the two semi-circular flower beds already there. Three bespoke curved seats designed by Richard were constructed by Chris Greenlaw at Driffield. They were a challenge to make but public approval has been rewarding. An inscribed stone commemorating the 60th anniversary of the Queen's Coronation and carved by Matthias Garn, Master Mason, almost completes the design. Only the permanent planting around these remains to be added in the autumn.

Now the Garden has several extra seats with some existing ones moved to new positions and the new planting and trees will soon add to the general interest. It is

always a pleasure to see visitors coming in so purposefully to enjoy this special space and, blessed with warm weather, even more are doing so in 2013. I would like to thank the Civic Society membership for all the support given to this project. In particular I am very grateful to the members of the Garden Group sub-committee for their practical assistance in making it a reality.


