The *Sheraton*Another remarkable Beverley trawler

Readers may be well aware of the only intact steam trawler the *Viola*, made in Beverley in 1906, but still languishing in South Georgia awaiting her return to be restored. But who knows about the career of another remarkable Cook Welton and Gemmell built steam trawler; the *Sheraton*?

Built at a similar time to the Viola, 1907, she was a busy Grimsby based fishing trawler, but was soon to be caught up with the growing hostilities of the 20th century. The Royal Navy needed all the power it could get to resist the increasingly large German fleet. In 1914, along with many other trawlers, she was requisitioned by the Royal Navy and took on the role of laying and patrolling anti-submarine booms. After the war she returned to fishing from Grimsby. But with the commencement of World War II, she was again requisitioned by the Royal Navy and this time armed with a 6-pounder gun and, with an amended bow, she apparently looked like a torpedo boat. The ship was registered as an armed patrol vessel and served along the North Sea coast; familiar waters no doubt but quite a change of role!


She survived both World Wars, but an unpleasant fate awaited her afterwards! All her equipment was stripped out, and she was painted bright 'daffodil' yellow, and was moored in the Wash off Brest Sand for target practice by the RAF, no doubt flying from those many Lincolnshire and Norfolk airfields.

Then, in April 1947 in severe gales, she broke her moorings and drifted across the Wash to beach at Old Hunstanton, where she remains to this day as visible evidence of the effects of war, and a curiosity to the many North Norfolk residents and tourists; a rather sad ending to a distinguished life starting at Beverley's renowned ship yard.


